Elise Beacom

Qualifications and experience:

I began my career as a journalist in print and community radio, before moving into the international development and humanitarian sector with the United Nations and non-governmental organisations (NGOs) based everywhere from Afghanistan to Melbourne. It has been my pleasure and privilege to circle back to community radio at PBS, where I have served as a Director since August 2023.

My professional experience spans fundraising, resource mobilisation, proposal development, donor reporting, communications, project and people management and strategy design. While I will bring all these skills to PBS if I am elected to the Board, my strengths in fundraising and revenue generation will be my biggest asset for ensuring financial sustainability of the station we all love.

Some highlights from my experience in fundraising and revenue generation include developing \$20M of successful proposals and cases-for-support, solicited from high-net worth individuals and trusts and foundations while at Monash University. There, I played a lead role facilitating the University's largest fundraising campaign in its history, "Change It. For Good." which exceeded its target of raising \$500M over 10 years. At Oxfam Australia, I led the business development team which secured \$30M+ in institutional funding for projects across the Asia-Pacific region in a 12-month period. At Oxfam, I was responsible for contributing our institutional funding projections and scenario planning for the organization's triennial, Income Plan, and conducted regular pipeline planning and income reporting.

My background is strongly focused in the not-for-profit and for purpose sectors, primarily with international development and humanitarian organisations, from the United Nations Office for Project Services, to UN Environment, Oxfam Australia and the Irish NGO, GOAL. With these organisations, I sat in various senior leadership and advisory roles, notably serving on two committees at Oxfam Australia. These were the Ethical Checking Committee, which assessed risks and opportunities associated with proposed private sector engagements, and the Australian NGO Cooperation Program Steering Committee which made investment decisions on a \$10M (annual) project portfolio.

I have continued to refine my communication skills over 14+ years, which I have transferred to diverse contexts, from journalism to high-end philanthropic proposal development (\$1M+) and grant

proposal writing, to annual reports, donor reports and strategic planning documents. I currently work on a running podcast called For the Kudos, which keeps me abreast of current trends in podcasting, audience development and social media.

As a leader, I bring an authentic style and people-centered approach, supporting personnel to harness their strengths in the workplace. Priding myself on open and honest communication, I supported my team at Oxfam Australia to navigate a large organisational change process, while simultaneously needing to adapt to unique ways of working during the Covid lockdowns in Victoria.

I hold a Bachelor of Arts (Journalism)/International Studies from the University of South Australia, and a Master of Applied Anthropology and Participatory Development from Australian National University.
